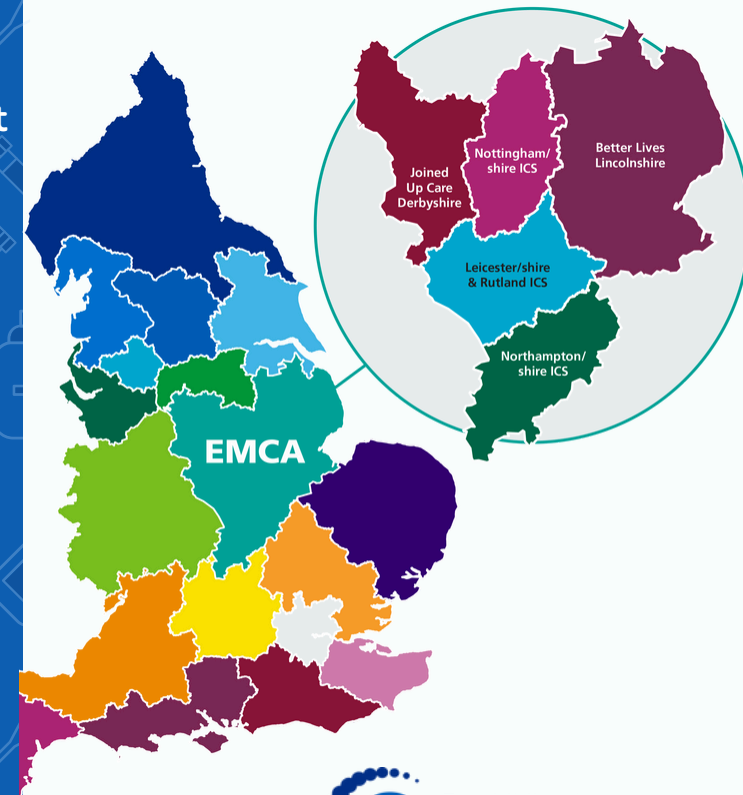

Receiving a cancer diagnosis can be an overwhelming experience for patients and their families.
